

XSPlatforms' headquarters and workshop are located in Gorinchem, The Netherlands. A small country in Europe, known for tulips, wooden shoes (clogs), cheese, windmills, bicycles and the Amsterdam canals.

Did you know that **about 1/3 of the Netherlands lies below sea level?** Most of the areas below sea level are man-made. To prevent the sea from reclaiming the land an intricate system of dikes was constructed. One of the most famous is called the Delta Works.

You'll see when you arrive in the Netherlands that **most** of the country is extremely flat, the highest point of the country can be found in the south with a height of only 322 meters above NAP. The lowest point sits at 6,7 meters below NAP.

Much of the countryside next to the freeways is used for agriculture, as such you can spot grasslands, cows and sheep from the car. **When driving from the top** of the Netherlands, **it takes about 4 hours to reach the lowest border.**

Another interesting fact, the Netherlands is home to more bikes than people. and the Dutch cycle an average distance of 2,9 km per day.





The Netherlands has a moderate marine climate. The average summer temperature is around 19°C (67°F), and the average winter temperature is 2°C (35°F). The weather is often topic of conversation as it's hard to properly predict, or changes drastically during the day.

HOW TO GET AROUND

The Netherlands has a vast public transportation network with trains, busses, trams and metros that will help you get around. You can also rent a car (you'll need an International Driving Permit), flag a cab, or catch an Uber.

Within cities you can often walk, or you could join the locals by renting a bike.



CURRENCY

The Euro is the official currency of the Netherlands. Debit cards and contactless payment types are very common throughout the Netherlands. Credit cards, however, are not widely accepted in shops.

TIPPING


Tipping in the Netherlands is not a requirement, as people working in hospitality earn living wages. That said, a tip shows your gratitude, and will be greatly appreciated. As a rule of thumb, you can either round-up the bill or leave between 0-10% of the bill as tip.

The standard voltage is 230V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz

Gin was invented in the Netherlands, but it was called jenever. Ketel 1 is one of the more well-known brands.




Though you'll find a lot of churches in Dutch cities, more than half of the inhabitants of the Netherlands are not religious.



The capital of the Netherlands has lots to offer to travelers. Amsterdam holds more than 100 kilometers of canals, with over 1,500 bridges to cross the water. De Magere Brug (literally: the skinny bridge) is possibly the most famous of all the bridges. You can walk around the city to explore the canals, as they form concentric belts around the city, or take a boat tour through the canals. Alongside the canals are can find many monumental canal houses.

But Amsterdam is also home to some of The Netherlands' most prestigious museums. The Dutch National Museum, The Rijksmuseum, is located in the center of Amsterdam. You can easily spend an entire day in this museum as the collection spans over 7 million items. Less than 500 meters from the Rijksmuseum you can find the Van Gogh museum and the Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam (Museum of Modern Art), as well as the Royal Concertgebouw (concert hall). Next to the world famous Anne Frank House, Amsterdam also houses small museums like the Ons' Lieve Heer op Solder a 17th-century canal house with a Catholic church in the attic.



Located around 15 kilometer north of Amsterdam, the Zaanse Schans is an open-air museum in which you can take a stroll through a traditional Dutch village. Take a look at the warehouse, were clogs are made, of visit the cheese factory. The Zaanse Schans is full of wooden houses, mills, barns and workshops.



MARKEN OR VOLENDAM

The village of Marken provides picturesque traditional wooden houses as well as an insight in fishing culture. As Marken used to flood often residents built their homes on 'werven', artificially built hills, or stilts.

From Marken you can quickly reach Volendam another traditional town with colorful wooden houses. The main street is lined with seafood vendors, as befitting a traditional fisher's village.



THE HAGUE IS THE SEAT OF THE DUTCH GOVERNMENT, AND HOUSES MANY MINISTRIES, EMBASSIES AND SEVERAL HEADQUARTERS OF INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS. SUCH AS THE INTERNAL COURT OF JUSTICE.

You can tour the seat of parliament, Het Binnenhof, on days when there are no political meetings. Otherwise you can only enjoy the outside of the structure. A large scale renovation will start in 2020, blocking the view of the entire structure for about 5 years.

The Hague is also where the King's working palace, Palace Noordeinde, can be found. The palace is not open to the public, but you can visit the palace garden.



UTRECHT'S ANCIENT CITY CENTER ALSO HOLDS CANALS, BUT UNLIKE AMSTERDAM THE CANALS FEATURE MANY WHARF/DOCK CELLARS. THE WHARFS WERE ADDED TO CREATE AN INNER CITY HARBOR SYSTEM. THE WHARF CELLARS HAD PEDESTRIAN WALKWAYS, HENCE CREATING A UNIQUE TWO-LEVEL STREET SYSTEM ALONG THE CANALS. TODAY MANY OF THESE CELLARS HAVE BEEN TRANSFORMED INTO SHOPS OR EVEN RESTAURANTS.

Compared to Amsterdam, Utrecht's canals are less know to tourists. Like many Dutch cities Utrecht is laid out around a church tower The 14th century Dom Tower, the highest church tower in the Netherlands, marks the hearth of the old city. Unfortunately the Dom Tower is currently undergoing restoration works, meaning it's facade is partially covered. However, you can still climb the tower. A unique chance because you can see the restoration up close as you climb to 100 meters instead of 95 meters.

The city of Rotterdam is a major port in the Netherlands, dating back to medieval times. Most of the city center of Rotterdam had to be rebuilt after being destroyed in air attacks during World War II. The Great St. Lawrence Church is all that's left of Rotterdam's medieval buildings.

The modern city center holds many architectural highlights, such as the Cube Houses designed by Dutch architect Piet Blom or the Art Nouveau style White House.

Rotterdam's massive port occupies almost half of the city's total area. The so called Gateway to Europe (Europoort) can be toured by boat. Next to the port, the Euromast is one of Rotterdam's most distinctive marks. The 185 meter tower houses two restaurants with stunning views over Rotterdam.



THE WINDMILLS OF KINDERDIJK

Kinderdijk is a small village that holds the largest surviving concentration of windmills in the Netherlands. 19 windmills, built between 1722 and 1761 can be seen. Some of the windmills are now used as homes, which is why not all mills are open for visitors.

The city in which XSPlatforms is located also hold historic value. Founded around 1000 CE by fishermen and farmers, Gorinchem (also called Gorcum) became a fortified city. Only one of the four old city gates still remains, with another being preserved in the gardens of the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam. Gorinchem is the largest fortified city in the Netherlands that's still fully intact.

A 5km self-guided walk takes you over the earthwork ramparts and past sights like the tollhouse, the Dalempoort (the last remaining city gate) and two flour mills. One of which is currently undergoing renovations (De Hoop). The other mill (Nooit Volmaakt) is still fully operational and houses a small shop. Gorinchem is also the birthplace of Hendrik Hamel, who was the first Westerner to provide a firsthand account of Korea.



LOEVESTEIN CASTLE

At the other side of the river from Gorinchem you can find Loevestein Castle. The castle's history spans about 650 years. Loevestein became notorious worldwide as the place in which the world-famous legal scholar, Hugo Grotius (Dutch: Hugo de Groot), was imprisoned and from which he subsequently escaped.
